## **Emily's Chronicles**

March 2023

"No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."—Romans 8: 37-39 NRSV

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ of Cody UMC,

We are in Lent and we find ourselves on a beautiful, crazy, life giving journey of deepening our faith. Lent is a beautiful time. Liturgically, there are some remarkable things at work. Spiritually, Lent invokes something within me. It reminds me that our human understanding is limited, but Gods love and understanding is limitless.

In our humanness, we find ourselves living in binaries- either its right or wrong, black or white, right or left. We are not always comfortable with the idea of there being more to offer or experience. If we have more choices, than that means we may choose something that is different from the rest. And change is hard. Change is something we struggle with. We don't care to admit it, but it's true.

The United Methodist Church is experiencing immense change. Not the first time, mind you, but a change that has shaped the denomination in ways we have never experienced before. You might have heard some things regarding the Global Methodist Church, disaffiliation, and even things about me as a pastor. I want to clear the air. I want to put rumors to rest. When rumors circle around, harm is done. There is no room for life giving conversation and discernment if we allow rumors to remain.

This all started with the special General Conference that was held in May of 2019. This conference was to address changes to the Book of Discipline, specifically language around homosexuality, marriages of homosexuals, and ordination of homosexual clergy. The plan that was voted on and approved was the Traditional Plan, meaning the language would NOT change, would not be affirming. The language regarding homosexuality in the Book of Discipline has not changed since 1972.

With the Traditional Plan voted on, it was at General Conference of 2020 that new plans would be proposed to change the language. However, Covid hindered that opportunity, and so General Conference was pushed back to 2022. With many conferences outside the United States still being impacted by Covid, and finding safe ways for the General Conference to meet, it was pushed again to May of 2024.



Within this time, the Global Methodist Church was created- a split from the UMC, mainly by the Wesleyan Covenant Association. As of May 1 of 2022, the GMC has been active, still working out a few logistics, but has made their stance on homosexuality- they are conservative theologically and uphold the Traditional Plan in their Book of Discipline. What does that mean for the UMC, and for our church potentially?

First thing to make clear: NO action or vote is needed to REMAIN in connection with the United Methodist Church. If we as a congregation wanted to leave, the delegates of 2019 General Conference voted to approve a grace-filled way for congregations to disaffiliate from the UMC based on "reasons of conscience regarding a change in the requirements and provisions of the Book of Discipline related to the practice of homosexuality or the ordination or marriage of self-avowed practicing homosexuals." What this means is churches can leave if they do not wish to be affirming or reconciling churches in the UMC.

IF we wanted to disaffiliate, meaning we would not agree with the affirming changes in the Book of Discipline, then we start the process of leaving the denomination. We would no longer be Cody United Methodist Church. People believe that's where the process ends. That is far from the truth. It is not just a yes or no. It's a yes we stay, and nothing changes, or a no we leave and then many things change.

Disaffiliation requires 2/3 majority vote by professing members. Professing members are those who have joined the church either by profession of faith, transfer of membership from another church/denomination, or through baptism in the church. We keep an accurate list of who are members and who are attendees. If you have questions regarding membership, you can always come to the office.

IF we were to disaffiliate, there is an application process we initiate with our District Superintendent, and with the Conference. There is also taking care the matter regarding property. Because the property belongs to the conference, we would have to work with the Board of Trustees from the Conference to gaining ownership of property- church building, grounds, and parsonage.

IF we were to disaffiliate, the church would be responsible for two years of pension liability and mission shares/apportionments. Our church is responsible for a certain amount of the pension and paying towards mission shares of the Conference, and the Conference covers the rest. If we were to leave, the Conference would need the remaining amount plus a year as a pro-rate to help cover the costs for the clergy remaining in the UMC and for the missions within the UMC of Mountain Sky.

This brings me to my next point. As I'm sure you are all aware- I am an affirming pastor. I am an ally to my LGBTQIA2S+ siblings. I was in seminary when General Conference voted on the Traditional Plan for the Book of Discipline, and I saw my classmates and peers lives changed forever. I had members of my ordination class denied because of issues regarding sexuality, and it was hard to see their dreams of ordination be crushed, while I was uplifted and praised. As an ally, I will stand up for the changes in the Book of Discipline. That being said, I will remain in connection with the UMC. IF our congregation was to disaffiliate, I would request a new appointment and would no longer serve as the pastor of this congregation.

I have heard some things regarding my beliefs and what I would enact from the pulpit. I do not believe I push agendas. I make my beliefs known, but I do not wish to push my beliefs onto others. We all have our agreements and differences, that's human nature. I stand to welcome ALL who come through the doors of our beloved church. If people are not feeling welcomed, things need to change.

Our Administrative Council has had conversations around whether or not we should remain in the UMC. We all feel that remaining UMC is the better option, but we want to create opportunities for listening sessions around disaffiliation. Those will be held in late spring. We as an Administrative Council want to be transparent about where we stand and want the churches support. Time and time again, I have heard many of you say that you want to welcome all people, serve all people and be invested in this community. I have heard you say you want to live by the phrase "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors." If this truly is the case, I believe disaffiliation will only hinder that idea for us. If we want to welcome all, remaining within the UMC will do that.
