APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved, seconded, and passed that the Minutes of Feb. 12, 2025 be approved.

WHOLE CHURCH BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

It was moved, seconded, and passed to move \$17,000 to be used for parsonage and church repairs from the Endowment Funds to Pinnacle Bank. The motion passed.

WORSHIP

Jenny reported that we had a successful Lent Season. Events included Fat Tuesday Celebration, Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday Service, Good Friday Service, Stations of the Cross Viewing, Easter Sunday Service with 108 attendees, and Easter Brunch with 78-80 parishioners attending.

Mothers' Day went well and Fathers' Day plans will be completed soon.

Peace with Justice Sunday worship service will be on June 15, 2025.

Discussion about Communion Services will be after Pastor Alex arrives.

FINANCE

Bryan reported that the budget is ok. Gretchen will be in the video booth in July.

GOOD SAM

Pastor reported that our spending for assistance is down a bit which is not unusual for this time of year. The next meeting will be Wednesday, May 21 at 10:00am in the parlor.

Kandi will meet with Pastor Alex to introduce him to the Good Sam Program.

Pastor Emily suggested that we keep funding in house so that we can have annual records of applicants and expenditures.

Next Meeting, August 13, 2025 at 5:30 in the parlor.



Mountain Sky Annual Conference 2025 Report

AC 2025 was held at St. Andrew UMC in Highlands Ranch, CO (south side Denver) with an online option and presided by the new Mountain Sky Bishop Kristin Stoneking. It began with opening Worship which included a Memorial Service for Clergy, their Spouses, and Conference Leaders who have passed in the last year. Bev Wanders was one of those honored in this service.

Next, guest speaker Bishop Israel Painit, spoke of his duties and challenges as Bishop of the diverse Region which includes the Southern Philippines and Laos with many cultural backgrounds and hundreds of dialects.

The Mountain Sky Ratification Team lead a panel discussion around regionalization as well as the other three pieces of legislation before the body which were passed at General Conference 2020-2024 and require affirmation at each annual conference.

These included: #1 Regionalization which allows for effective and relevant contextual ministries which recognize the cultural differences in the eight "Regions" of the United Methodist Church (Three regions in Europe, three in Africa, and one region each in both the US and the Philippines), #2 Which protects membership rights for all individuals, #3 The Church's role to combat racism in all forms and #4 An amendment which makes clear educational requirements for Licensed Local Pastors to be eligible as voting members.

Results of these ratification votes will only be known after all UMC Annual Conferences are able to vote this year.

Conference committees presented reports of their past year and planned activities and missions. The Finance committee was unable to present a budget at this time due to a recent retirement, personnel changes and delays completing an audit. A special session will be conducted this fall online to complete that process.

Several churches gave reports on mission projects using UMC grants and we heard and voted on various petitions for resolutions and church closures. Four small churches with membership in near single digits were unable to continue ministry after many decades, that for some started in the 1890's. Two were from Colorado, and Wheatland UMC and Medicine Bow UMC in Wyoming.

Friday meetings included separate Laity and Clergy sessions and afternoon Worship with a Baptism, a Laity address, Youth address, and Commissioning of the Lewis family to a Global Mission project in New Mexico.

Closing Worship on Saturday afternoon was an Ordination Service with the Commissioning of three new Pastors including our Pastor Alex Hunnes, Ordination of four Elders, Commisioning of one Deaconess and one Deacon, Ordination of two Deconesses and one Deacon, and the Appointment of nine Licensed Local Pastors.

From the Membership/Nurture committee:


Mark August 10th on your calendar. We are having an Ice Cream Social following worship service. It will be a great treat for the hot days of August.
