Finance Update

We have reached our \$18,000 fund-raising goal for the new carpet. Donations currently exceed \$18,000. Any additional donations and the proceeds from the auction will be used to offset the \$18,000 that we pulled from our endowment funds to cover half the carpet cost. Thank you to everyone who contributed. As always, our congregation comes through when we need extra help.

We are still proceeding with the auction. Swenson's auctioneers have been handling some estate auctions which have pushed back their consignment auction. The latest news is that we will be taking items to Powell in early November. You can still drop items by the church if you want. As before we will do a pickup of large items when we are finally ready to deliver. The auction will hopefully finish before the end of the year. Whenever it happens the proceeds will be used to fund the new carpet.

One final note on general fund giving. As of the end of September we are on track to meet our giving goal for the year. We also thank you for that. Normally 30 percent of our annual giving occurs in November and December. As we go into the holiday season, we ask that you keep us in mind. We know that rising inflation is impacting all of us, including our church expenses. Utility costs for the church are projected to be 20 percent higher than last year.

We thank you for all that you do to help support our church and our missions.

Old Business

Nominations Check-in

Ann Armel reported that we are in need of volunteers to serve on committees for next year. Also a Lay Leader is needed. Please contact Ann or someone on the Nominations Committee if you would like to volunteer.

The 2022 Charge Conference will be held at 11:30 on Sunday, December 11th, after Worship. We encourage everyone to attend this important event.

Committee Reports

There will be a Worship Committee meeting Thursday October 27th at 10:30 to begin planning for Advent.

Good Samaritan - Pat gave us an update on our assistance activity so far this year. She and Pastor will be sharing this information with the congregation on October 30th during Worship. Pat also informed Ad Council that when she leaves Pastor and Kandi will be taking her place.

Missions - The Mission Committee will have their next meeting October 23rd, 11:15 a.m. They will discuss their duties for serving at Ann Ayres birthday party on November 13th. They also will be discussing the Bake Sale scheduled for November 20th, that benefits Spirt Mountain Hospice. The Committee is planning an Advent project of a food drive for Cody Cupboard or outreach for kids at Eastside School.

Trustees - Gene reported that The Carpet Project should be completed by October 14th or 15th and we can possibly meet for Worship in our church on Sunday October 16th! The Trustees are very pleased with the carpet. Pastor will take care of thank you notes. Gene also reported that the egress windows are here and he will be setting up a time for them to be installed.

Discipling Team - Ann reported that the Team hasn't met in a awhile and may be looking at other options. She also informed us:
