October 11, 2022 Minutes Approved as corrected.

Old Business

Trunk n' Treat - Suzanne and Pastor Emily reported that everyone had a good time as they enjoyed the food, the decorations, and our generosity. We served 260 hotdogs! The Ad Council agreed that Trunk n' Treat is a good tradition and that we should continue it next year.

Budget - The budget was presented for approval with one correction. The correction has to do with the Good Samaritan Fund proposal. Gene moved that the Budget be approved with the correction, Suzanne seconded the motion and the Motion passed.

New Business

Pastor Emily and Bryan presented a proposal for Pat Salyer to continue with the Good Samaritan Fund duties (remotely) through the end of the year. Starting in January, we are looking to use a Service Contract to provide Good Samaritan Fund Operations. The Good Samaritan team and Bryan will continue to work on the details for this proposal.

Committee Reports

Safety - Byron reported that committee members are continuing to sanitize the church each Saturday. He also reminded us that there will be Certification classes, held in January, for those who need to be certified in CPR and First Aid.

Finance - Bryan reported that our church finances are in good shape. The Budget will be presented at Charge Conference on Sunday December 11, 2022 after Worship.

Worship - Jenny reported that the celebration for Pat and Howard went very well and there were lots of people in attendance. Also Pat and Howard appreciated the picture and the other cards and gifts.

Christmas plans are going well. On November 20th, a group of parishioners will put up the decorations in the Sanctuary, the Koelmel Hall, and the Narthex.

A Blue Christmas service will be held on December 21st at 5:00pm. The time for Christmas Eve Service is 8:00pm and Christmas Day Service is 10:00am.

UWF - Karen reported that they will be meeting November 9th. The program will be presented by Brandie Gann from the CASA program.

The Committee is also completing plans for the Cookie Stroll on December 11th after worship. The Committee decided to rotate their leadership for this year by having past Presidents take turns leading their meetings. It was also reported that Annette Stone is in the process of completing the Program Book.

Membership/Nurture - Carolyn reported that fourteen-First letters have been sent with six recipients not responding and eight recipients being removed. The Committee also sent out nine-Second letters with zero recipients responding.

This will be discussed at Charge Conference on December 11thafter Worship. Carolyn has asked that if someone wishes to attend another church to please let the church know so our records can be kept up to date.

Education - Suzanne reported that the youth have started a new curriculum. There are15 kids that have been attending Youth Group. The book they are studying is 'Imaginary Jesus'. Also the group is presently meeting at Trinity Lutheran Church and will be meeting at Cody UMC starting in January 2023.

SPR - Kandi reported that evaluations have gone well and the last 3 will be completed on November 29th. The Committee also approved their budget.

Trustees- Gene reported that the Carpet Program went very well. We even received a donation from one of the carpet installers. There was a group of members that took two trailer loads and three pickup loads to the auction site on Monday. The installation of the windows in the parsonage will be postponed until Spring due to illness of the installer. We are praying for his recovery. There was a bit of water in the basement of the parsonage recently. It has been temporarily taken care of and will be worked on next Spring. Also, the Trustees send a big welcome to new Trustees Cameron Newton and Bryan Armel.

Missions - Linda reported that the Missions Committee will be serving at Ann Ayres' 90th Birthday Celebration on November 13th after Worship. There will be a Bake sale on Sunday, November 20th. Volunteers need to bring their goods to the kitchen and the committee will take care of the placement of the baked goods. The funds will go to Spirit Mt Hospice.

Pastor's Remarks- Pastor reported that all is going well with her, Alex, and Thea. Recently Pastor was a part of Clergy Zoom meeting where it was announced that we will still have six Districts in our Conference with no merging and Mark Calhoun will remain as the District Superintendent. Three new Bishops were announced. And it was also announced that Bishop Karen Oliveto will be resigning in 2024.

Pastor reported that Class is going well and an 'Historical Jesus' class will be offered in January or February. Also a 'Revelation' class will be offered around March. Pastor Emily encouraged all of our members to attend Charge Conference if they can, as there are important issues to discuss and vote on.
